Logistics Segment

The Logistics Segment manages distribution centers mainly at major Japanese trade ports, with facilities capable of handling approximately 600,000 tons. As a logistics business that supports people's daily life infrastructure, we will continue to provide comprehensive logistics services, including customs clearance, storage, and transportation of a wide range of products, with a focus on low-temperature products.



Consideration of business environment and medium-term direction

While the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic persists, we are seeing a recovery in the handling volume through collection activities for marine products, meat products, and frozen foods. However, due to the impact of the Ukraine conflict. soaring energy prices and rising logistics costs could also have a significant impact on the unit.

While we continue to gauge when the COVID-19 pandemic will be under control, we also intend to secure storage capacity by adding new distribution facilities, strengthen our transportation and delivery functions by establishing a cooperative framework with major transportation companies, improve the efficiency of truck operations in cooperation with consignors and improve efficiency by the standardization of business activities and the introduction of advanced technologies. We will continue to develop our business proactively.



Issues of the previous Medium-term Management Plan


- Scrapping and building aging facilities
